Welcome to our latest newsletter. We have been busy working with our partners to tackle the issues that have been identified by you as priorities for your local area. Here is an update about some of the actions we have taken to tackle these issues. Our priorities were:

Anti-social behaviour in the centre of Brixworth and Spratton during evenings -

We have carried out 95 dedicated patrols to support this priority. One person was arrested for possession of drugs and another for drink driving. Several youngsters have been dealt with for motoring offences.

Raising crime prevention awareness in relation to Car key Burglary in Harlestone, Great and Little Brington, Church and Chapel Brampton -

With the help of Neighbourhood Watch (NHW), specific crime prevention leaflets have been delivered to all homes; in addition we have carried out 54 dedicated high visibility patrols in this area to prevent, deter and detect offences. There have been no similar crimes in these villages since that action.

Tackling your priorities

Raising Crime prevention awareness in relation to burglary in the villages of Old and Walgrave -

With the help of NHW, specific crime prevention leaflets have been delivered to all homes in Old and Walgrave. In addition, we have conducted 35 specific patrols in the area to prevent, deter and detect offences and anti-social behaviour.

Moulton Lane, Boughton. Speeding during 'rush hour' periods -

We have carried out 12 specific visits to Moulton Lane to conduct speed enforcement and 17 fixed penalties have been issued to offenders. We also conducted speed enforcement visits to Overstone and Holcot and issued four further tickets. In addition we have conducted 71 directed patrols to the area to prevent, deter and detect anti-social behaviour and other offences.

We visited Overstone car boot sale and seized counterfeit goods on behalf of Trading Standards.

Solve it Action for Schools

Each year, four Schools from Northamptonshire are offered the 'Solve it' project and this time Falconers Hill Junior School was chosen. Solve it volunteers, supported by the local PCSO Glyn Lewis, visited the school to promote awareness of the types of products abused and emphasising the dangers. PCSO Lewis spoke to the children about anti-social behaviour and keeping safe.

The children were encouraged to produce a Scrapbook about what they have learnt.

Getting the message across to those involved in anti-social behaviour

Operation Guardian continues to target those involved in burglary, vehicle crime and robbery, Operation Nightsafe is taking a zero tolerance approach to alcohol related violence and disorder, and throughout the county, local Community Safety Partnerships are working together to tackle, not tolerate, anti-social behaviour.

Anti-social behaviour – tackling not tolerating

Anti-social behaviour (ASB) is any aggressive, intimidating or destructive activity that damages or destroys another person's quality of life. It covers many types of behaviour by people of all ages, from rowdy, inconsiderate and noisy behaviour, to fly tipping, littering, graffiti and vandalism, and can impact people from all communities, preventing a peaceful community life and degrading the environment.

Throughout Northamptonshire, our Community Safety Partnerships are working together to **tackle, not tolerate** anti-social behaviour.

We are bringing offenders to justice through the Local Criminal Justice Board and Community Payback schemes, and focusing on individuals through preventative initiatives before they venture down the road of crime and disorder. We are also providing many diversionary activities for people of all ages to get involved in, and in turn are changing the perceptions of ASB in our communities.

Together, and in partnership, we are **Confident Against Anti-Social Behaviour**.

Cameras on the move to combat crime

The Daventry District and South Northamptonshire Community Safety Partnership has funded the redeployable cameras for use at various locations around the district. They will be operated and footage reviewed by Northamptonshire Police's Safer Community Team. The cameras will be moved around to different areas that are experiencing issues with anti-social behaviour.



The Community Safety Partnership brings together partners including Daventry District Council, South Northamptonshire Council, Northamptonshire County Council, Northamptonshire Police and the Police Authority, Northamptonshire Fire & Rescue Service, NHS Northamptonshire and the Probation Service to reduce crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour within the community. It also continuously works to improve the level of confidence residents have with their local authorities, and to reduce the fear of crime.
